

CONTRIBUTING TO QUACKTECH QUARTERLY

Quacktech Quarterly welcomes original technical articles related to vintage and modern electronics, test equipment, radio, computers, restoration, repair, measurement, technical history, unusual equipment, collections, museums and practical engineering.

We are particularly interested in articles based on real experience: restorations, fault investigations, measurements, unusual problems, undocumented details, technical projects and subjects that may otherwise remain scattered through personal notes or online discussions.

| Submissions

Submissions should be complete articles, substantially ready for publication.

The author is expected to provide all the material necessary to understand the article: complete text, technical explanations, measurements and results where applicable, conclusions, illustrations, photographs, diagrams, captions and references.

Please submit the article in the form in which you would reasonably expect to see it published.

Preliminary outlines, collections of notes, incomplete drafts or material requiring substantial additional research or technical development should not normally be submitted unless specifically requested.

There is no fixed article length. The subject should determine the appropriate length, provided that the article remains clear, self-contained and worthwhile.

| Language and Format

Articles should preferably be written in English. Perfect English is not required, but the text should be sufficiently clear and complete to permit normal editorial work.

Text can be supplied in common editable formats such as Word, LibreOffice, Pages or plain text.

Images should preferably be supplied as separate original files, at the highest practical resolution. Photographs, screenshots, diagrams and schematics are welcome. Each illustration should have a suitable caption.

| Technical Responsibility

Authors remain responsible for the technical content of their articles, including measurements, statements, conclusions and the correct identification of sources.

Facts, measurements, interpretations and hypotheses should be clearly distinguished where this is relevant.

Quacktech Quarterly may correct language, style, typography and presentation. We may also propose changes, additions, alternative formulations or other modifications before publication. Substantial technical revisions, additional research or preparation of missing material remain the responsibility of the author.

| Editorial Decision

Submission of an article does not imply acceptance or publication.

Quacktech Quarterly reserves the right to accept, reject, postpone or propose modifications to any submitted contribution, at its editorial discretion.

No publication date can be guaranteed in advance.

Articles whose primary purpose is commercial promotion may be rejected. Technical articles concerning the author's own products, projects or activities may nevertheless be considered when they contain genuine technical information and any relevant commercial interest is made clear.
